Question 3) How can MID help businesses in their service area?

All businesses are impacted by electrical costs. MID has 13,061 commercial accounts and 143 industrial accounts. Those accounts represent businesses both large and small that are impacted by MID rates. On the water side, we all know that agriculture is a major economic engine in our region and that there are many businesses that form part of our agricultural economy. For us, water availability is key to having a thriving economy. By protecting our water, we are also protecting local businesses that depend on it.



Question 4) What are the greatest challenges MID faces and how would you address them?

Our two greatest challenges will be protecting our water and controlling electrical costs. We have been engaged in fights with the state for years over the Bay-Delta Plan and protecting our water rights. I believe that will continue to be a problem in the years to come. We need an MID Board that can work collaboratively and professionally together to present a united front against such attempts. We also have to ensure that people outside of our district cannot access our MID water resources for less than market value. In May, my opponent voted to sell our water to outside interests at a 70% discount – for \$60 an acre–foot, which is below market value. I did not agree with that vote. If we do have excess water, it should be sold at market rate and that money should be reinvested to benefit MID ratepayers. In addition, the Board has voted to raise electrical rates, putting additional cost burdens on families and businesses. I fundamentally do not agree with charging ratepayers more and giving outside interests discounts. I would oppose such actions on the Board.



Question 5) Do you believe the electric side of MID subsidizes the water side of MID? If so, what changes if any should be made?

This issue has been litigated and a judge has ruled that there is a subsidy. Late last year, another judge ruled that despite the subsidy ruling, there will be no reimbursement for ratepayers. This is an issue that is very complex and given that I am not currently on the MID Board, I have not had the opportunity to delve into this issue at length beyond what is available as public information. Fundamentally, I believe that MID needs to ensure fairness and low rates to benefit ratepayers on both the water side and the power side.
